

RESOLUTION OF TOLEDO CITY COUNCIL Recognizing

THE GLASS CITY DOG PARK

September 27, 2014

WHEREAS, there has never been a community off-leash dog park in the City of Toledo; and

WHEREAS, there are over 45,000 licensed dogs in the City of Toledo and over 62,000 licensed dogs in Lucas County; and

WHEREAS, dog parks are a safe place for dogs to run off-leash without concern of being hit by a car or other hazards, and well exercised dogs are less likely to bark excessively, destroy property or create nuisances; and

WHEREAS, dog parks are a great place for owners to meet other people with common interests and help foster a sense of community, and dog parks are a quality of life component necessary to retain and attract residents; and

WHEREAS, the City of Toledo has provided land for a dog park, and partnered with the non-profit organization "Toledo Unleashed" to develop and manage our first dog park!

NOW THEREFORE: Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Toledo that the members of Toledo Unleashed are congratulated for raising money and mobilizing broad based community support for The Glass City Dog Park, that our canine companions in our community now have a safe and fun place to play and socialize, and that today, September 27th 2014, henceforth, will be known as "Glass City Dog Park Day" in the City of Toledo.
